Lamia Barakat a Professor of Clinical Psychology in Pediatrics and Psychiatry at the University of Pennsylvania (UPENN) Perelman School of Medicine, the Stephen and Susan Kelly Endowed Chair in Behavioral Oncology, Director of Psychosocial Services and the Behavioral Oncology Research Program in the Division of Oncology at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia (CHOP), and co-Division Chief for the Division of Integrated Psychiatry, Psychology, and Behavioral Health in the Department of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences. As a senior investigator, her research focuses on implementation of evidence-based assessment of psychosocial risk and resilience in families of children newly diagnosed with cancer, development and implementation of family interventions to improve disease management and health-related quality of life in pediatric cancer treatment and survivorship, identifying strategies to increase recruitment and retention in pediatric clinical trials especially for those with health disparities, and strategies to promote successful adaptation and transition to adult care for adolescents and young adults with cancer. In addition, she currently serves as site PI for a trial of meaning-focused grief therapy for parents bereaved of childhood cancer.
