

Iris Paltin PhD, ABPP-CN

Iris Paltin is an Assistant Professor of Clinical Psychiatry at the University of Pennsylvania and a board certified pediatric neuropsychologist in the Cancer Center of the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. She specializes in assessing individuals with neuro-oncological conditions, and supervises graduate, intern, and post-doctoral level psychology trainees. Her research focuses on those who have received cranial proton radiation and children diagnosed with NF-1. Dr. Paltin developed the Executive Function Consultation, Education and Skills Clinic (EXCEL Clinic) within CHOP's Cancer Center which provides a brief problem-solving intervention for children, adolescents, and young adults who are at risk for executive function weakness. Dr. Paltin is also a co-PI on the Embedded Ancillary Study of Household Material Hardship and Neurocognitive Outcomes within the Children's Oncology Group's AALL1731 Protocol for patients with newly diagnosed standard risk leukemia.
