# STAR Act Funding

- In December 2022, Congress unanimously passed the Childhood Cancer STAR Reauthorization ACT of 2022 to continue for 5 more years (FY2024-2028)
  - S.4120 (117<sup>th</sup> Congress) led by Chris Van Hollen (D-MD), Jack Reed (D-RI), Shelley Moore Capito (R-WV), and Lisa Murkowski (R-AK) + 35 additional cosponsors
  - H.R.7630 (117<sup>th</sup> Congress) led by Michael McCaul (R-TX), Jackie Speier (D-CA),
     G.K. Butterfield (D-NC) and Mike Kelly (R-PA) + 106 additional co-sponsors
  - Signed into law on January 5, 2023 (Public Law No. 117-350)
- During Action Days 2024, advocates pushed to appropriate \$30 million to fully fund for a 7<sup>th</sup> year

# Accelerating Kids' Access to Care Act H.R. 4758/S. 2372

- Creates a new pathway for pediatric providers to enroll in multiple state Medicaid programs if certain requirements are met
- Focuses on the screening and enrollment of providers and
  - NOT on authorization of care by an out-of-state provider
  - NOR payment rates for any such care
- Introduced on July 19, 2023
  - House by Lori Trahan (D-MA) and Mariannette Miller-Meeks (R-IA)
    - 81 co-sponsors to date
  - Senate by Chuck Grassley (R-IA) and Michael Bennet (D-CO)
    - 35 co-sponsors to date

# Pediatric Cancer Drug Supply Act (H.R. 6963)

- Drug shortages are increasingly becoming more common and significantly impact patients and healthcare providers alike
  - Forces prioritizing treatments among patients
  - Disrupts clinical trials as well as delays care
- Creates a pilot program
  - Directs HHS to maintain a 6-month reserve of essential chemotherapy medicines for childhood cancer
- Bill introduced in the House on January 11, 2024 by Anna Eshoo (D-CA), Diana DeGette (D-CO) and Kim Schrier (D-WA)
  - O 15 co-sponsors to date

## Pending Federal Legislation - Take Action

H.R. 4758/S. 2372, Accelerating Kids' Access to Care Act (AKACA) — Cancer care for children is not always available close to home, which means many families must travel to other states for treatment. Accessing care in other states is time consuming and challenging to navigate. This legislation would improve children's access to needed out-of-state health care by streamlining the Medicaid provider screening and enrollment process.

## Nomination and Voting Process

- In April and May, the CAC2 Board of Directors will assess nominations for this year's annual election of the Board of Directors.
- Candidates selected for the slate will be announced in the CAC2 June Announcements.
- Voting will be conducted during the CAC2 members' business meeting.
- Only individual Members and the Voting Representative from Childhood Cancer Organization Members are eligible to vote.
- Written voting proxies are allowed for members not present at the members' business meeting in June.
- Each CAC2 member entitled to vote shall indicate support for or opposition to the slate of nominees.



## CAC2 Nomination Principles

- First-term board members have the option to stand for re- election at the end of their terms for a 2nd consecutive 3- year term.
- CAC2 Board is a working board (no paid positions), making it important to assemble a diverse set of backgrounds and skills to set and implement an effective strategy for the Coalition, its members, and the kids and families the CAC2 membership serve.

## **Staffing and Leadership Update**

The CAC2 Board of Directors voted to pursue an Association Management Company rather than directly paid staff positions

## Benefits of Association Management Model

- Access to resources, expertise and experience on multiple
- Roles are filled as needed- with appropriate expertise
- Capacity to grow or transition off as organization matures and evolves
- Consistent management as board continues to rotate through terms

## Timeline for Transition to Association Management

- 10 RFPs were emailed in February
- 3 AMCs have expressed interest/ 2 have submitted proposals
- Search Working Group (SWG) is currently evaluating proposals
- SWG meets to discuss and provide recommendation to board w/o 3/24
- Board Approval by 4/1
- Final Negotiations with AMC
- Transition timeline and oversight committee established 4/15

## CAC2's Mission


